Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 12, 2009
Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Amos 7:12-15

A reading from the Gospel according to **Mark**:

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick—
 no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them,
 "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them."
 So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Focus Questions:

1. Jesus instructs the Twelve to travel lightly. What can you do to live more simply?
2. Jesus sends the disciples out in pairs. Describe a time when you partnered with someone to complete a project.
3. We are not called to live the Christian life alone. How does the parish community support your faith?

Family and Children's Activity:

Jesus sends the disciples out on an errand. Talk about the time when someone trusted you to go on an errand for them.

JUSTICE & PEACE

Continuing from last week on the encyclical letter of Benedict XVI God is Love and understanding the immigration issue in the USA. Today we focus on the commandment to love. The commandment to love is not just a requirement, it is a command to love because love was first given by God to His creation of man. When this is understood then it becomes easier to understand the parables of Jesus like "The Rich Man" (Lk.16:19-31), Jesus takes up the cry of the rich man that his brothers be informed about what happens to those who ignore the needs of the poor. The message is to return to the right path. In The Good Samaritan (Lk 10:25-37), Jesus re-defines the word neighbor. Until this parable the word neighbor was one's own countryman and to foreigners living in the country. The parable did away with that understanding and said the obligation and command to love was for anyone in need. It was now extended to all mankind and calls us to a personal commitment. In the parable of The Last Judgment, Jesus identifies Himself with those in need.

What does this all mean in terms of justice and peace? Acts of violence is increasing in the USA against the foreigner especially the Hispanic immigrant. The Church has the obligation and duty to educate and inform its members as to their relationship with others in their daily life. How can we say we love God and hate our neighbor?

Affordable Homes on Long Island

The Long Island Housing Partnership with Nassau, Suffolk and the Town of Babylon is working to stabilize and revitalize foreclosed properties on L.I. The Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) is designed to stabilize and revitalize communities hard hit by the foreclosure crisis and also work with first time homebuyers to enable them to realize the "American Dream" of homeownership.

Under NSP, homes that have been foreclosed will be rehabilitated, enabling first time homebuyers to purchase them. A first time homebuyer is defined as anyone who has not owned property within the past three years. Homes will be sold to qualified homebuyers with household income at or below 120% of area median income (in 2009, \$122,200 for a family of 4). For additional info on NSP contact the L.I. 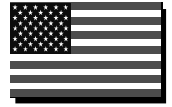
